Mission News in Bangladesh

In spite of recent attacks by Moslems, the Lord continues to cause His word to spread and grow. Pastor Monotosh has been able to begin a new evangelical field of the BLCM in the very northern district of Dinajpur, Bangladesh. He is working with a new nationality of people near the border of India of Malda district. This tribe's people called themselves Santal. The contact person name is Joel Murmu. Pastor Monotosh has been in contact with him for almost eight months and now he was able to meet him in person. Joel Murmu is eager to form a new congregation within this tribe. These tribal people have their own language and culture and traditions but they also know the Bengali language making communication possible. Pastor Monotosh is teaching Joel about Lutheranism and the true teaching of Scripture. Joel is serving without any financial support. Please pray for him and his family. Another BLCM Deacon, Anath Roy is conducting a theology study class with the lay leader and youth of the church in the Dinajpur district that they may be grounded in good theology and practice. Monotosh writes: "Though we are going through a difficult situation to continue the ministry, the Lord is granting tremendous success in the BLCM. Please pray for BLCM."

Bangladesh is a fertile land for the Gospel. The devil is trying to stop the gospel through persecution, but he cannot prevent Christ from building His Church in that land. Praise the Lord!

But I confess them to You because You have promised to forgive me for the sake of Your own dear Son who suffered and died for my sins. Lord, I desperately need Your Grace and Forgiveness. Be merciful to me, a poor, sinful being.

P: Upon this confession, I assure you that God is full of grace and mercy and for the sake of His Son, Jesus Christ, He has forgiven all your sins. May God keep you in His grace, trusting and serving Him until Christ comes again to take us to be with Him forever.

Advent Candle Lighting

The first Sunday of Advent we were reminded that **Christ came to Bethlehem to grant us HOPE**—the true Hope that does not disappoint. We light the first candle in remembrance of that Hope.

Light the First Candle

We can live in that Hope when we see and enjoy Christ's amazing Love. So the second Sunday of Advent often focuses on that great **LOVE**. The angels announced God's gift of love. For those who believe it, God's love shines in their hearts. For "the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us." Romans 5:5 "This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an

atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another." 1 John 4:9-11. We light the second candle and receive the warm glow of His Love.

Light the Second Candle

Response in Hope:

P: The steadfast love of God endures all the day.

C: I trust in the steadfast love of God forever and ever. (Ps. 52:1&8)

P: When the kindness and the love of God our Savior toward man appeared, not by works of righteousness which we have done,

C: but according to His mercy He saved us, through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit, (Titus 3:4-5)

P: In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world,

C: that we might live through Him.

P: In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

C: If God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. (1Jn. 4:9-11)

P: Now may the Lord direct your hearts into the love of God C: and into the patience of Christ. (2 Thessalonians 3:5)


- P: "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word;
